



## Are you interested in working in *Social Justice, Activism, and Human Rights?*

### **Apply to the new WGSS Master's Track in *Feminist Practices for Social Change* starting fall 2020!**

In one to three years, you will be ready to pursue professional activist work in a social justice and human rights organization immediately upon graduation.

After completing classes focused on social justice and human rights theory and practice, you will complete a Practicum internship to put your academic knowledge to use in your field of interest, for example: UN Women; on campus in units of the IWL, including with the globally-renowned NGO, The Center for Women's Global Leadership; and in organizations internationally.

### **This Track offers students many opportunities:**

- Be a teaching assistant for classes in the WGSS Social Justice Minor
- Participate in the bi-annual WGSS graduate student conference
- Present at or attend conferences related to activist work or academic research and apply for travel funding
- Study abroad in Europe for one semester through the GEMMA Program or in the summer at the European Institute in Kassel, Germany
- Complete a variety of Rutgers certificates including through The Center for Violence against Women and Children or the Department of Africana Studies
- Apply for graduate fellowships such as The Eagleton Institute for Politics Graduate Fellowship Program
